Ella Fitzgerald, that transports you in different time, explored themes of love, heartbreak, and injustice with an unparalleled vulnerability.

Billie Holiday's haunting voice and poignant lyrics continue to resonate with audiences, shedding light on the struggles of African Americans during the civil rights movement and beyond.

Gelia Cruz, forced to go into exile after the cuban revolution

Janis Joplin's raw, bluesy style challenged traditional gender norms in the music industry, while Amy Winehouse haunting melodies captured the essence of love and loss.

Madonna, Tina Turner and Cher, three iconic figures in pop music, have continuously reinvented themselves and shattered glass ceilings for women in the industry.

Mary J. Blaige's innovative production and empowering lyrics have influenced countless artists and redefined hip-hop.


These are just a few names we will encounter in this journey.


A procession of vibrant young voices, embracing the spirit of gospel, gradually joins them, united in their delivery of a profound and empowering message. In a breathtaking montage, images of






TRACK 3: THE NARRATOR

TRACK 5: THE KINTSUGI TECHNIQUE

Another powerful concept used at the end is the Kintsugi Technique.

Kintsugi is a traditional Japanese technique that involves repairing broken pottery using a creative and innovative approach. Rather than hiding the cracks and breaks, Kintsugi emphasizes them by filling them in with gold or other precious metals, turning the flaws into something beautiful and unique. This technique reflects the Japanese philosophy of Wabi-Sabi, which appreciates the beauty of imperfections. Kintsugi is not just a way to fix broken objects, but it also symbolizes the belief that our past experiences and imperfections are what makes us stronger and more beautiful which is the core perhaps of our message: what doesn't break you makes you stronger.

This will be used at the end, in the most powerful scene: it opens with a top-down view of a vinyl record illuminated by a spotlight, creating a dramatic yet mysterious atmosphere. Suddenly, a sound is heard and the vinyl begins to crack before our eyes. But just as quickly, the cracks are filled with gold paint, revealing a creative and unique use of the Kintsugi technique.

The silky voice of Andra Day begins to sing "Rise Up" as three spotlights illuminate

Emily Estefan on the guitar, ALICIA KEYS at a beautiful white piano, accompanied

by the other talented artists. The audience is drawn into this creative performance that

combines musical artistry with an eye-catching display of innovative techniques.

TRACK 6: THE 2 PIVOTAL MOMENTS

1) The beginning_

Black screen

Erupting into the auditory realm, the robust rendition of "It's a Man's World" by Christina Aguilera takes center stage.

The initial notes of the concluding song, "Rise Up" by Andra Day, fill the air, and a solitary spotlight gradually illuminates her. Initially alone on stage, she is soon accompanied by the other singers we had conversed with.

A procession of young singers, adopting a gospel style, gradually joins them to convey her powerful message. On the backdrop of screens, a montage showcases images of all the women we had discussed. The scene shifts to the screen displaying "The end," only to have it erased and replaced with the phrase, "To be continued."

TRACK 7: THE DIRECTOR_Francesca Ferretti
